Welcome to Evelyn Scott School

Evelyn Scott School is a 'Future Focused' school, we learn through an inquiry-based approach that connects learners and their learning to their world. We lead our community to engage with the ACT's *Future of Education Strategy* and all of its possibilities. Contemporary learning means preparing for a shifting future that requires skills and knowledge, citizenship, connection to culture and the environment and the capacity to solve complex problems with creative approaches.

Evelyn Scott School prepares learners for the 21st Century. They will build their capacity to solve problems, be critical thinkers and self directed learners. Through collaboration and effective communication, they will be inspired to navigate their futures and become life long learners.



My first day at Kindergarten

Day 1 - Monday 30 January 2022

Day 1 will begin at **9:00am**. Follow the signs to the Kindergarten building to meet your child's class teacher, receive their name tag, and meet your classmates and teachers.

After your child has met their teacher and settled in, you are welcome to join the school leadership team in our Community Room for light refreshments.

The school day finishes at **3:00pm**. Parents and Carers can wait outside the Kindergarten learning space for learners to exit. We require a hand to hand pick up for all kindergarten learners.

If your child is attending Out of School Hours Care, OSHC staff will collect them from the learning spaces and accompany them to the school gymnasium at the end of the school day.

Day 2 and beyond for Kindergarten Learners

Children in our Kindergarten can be dropped off by a parent or caregiver once the teacher welcomes the children into the classroom at **9:00am**. The Kindergarten day ends at **3:00pm**.

Collection of children in Kindergarten must involve a parent, carer or familiar adult who is listed on the child's enrolment form as an authorised nominee and emergency contact. Please contact the school via email to update or add to this list.



My first day of Year 1 to Year 6 for new Learners

Day 1 - Monday 30 January 2022

We invite new learners from Years 1 to Year 6, joining ESS for the first time in 2023 to visit from **10:00am to 11:00am** to meet their teacher and visit the learning spaces and play spaces.

New learners will spend their first full day at Evelyn Scott School from **Tuesday 31 January 2023**.

Day 2 and beyond for learners in Years 1 - 6

Playground supervision starts from **8:50am for learners in Year 1 - Year 6**. Learners are not able to be left unaccompanied in the school grounds before this time.

The school day will commence at **9:00am**. Please follow the signs to the Nature Playground to find a table with your child's year group and teacher. They will receive a name tag and head to their learning space.

In the afternoon, Parents and Carers are welcomed into the school gates from 2:45pm to wait outside their child's class if they choose. Our school day finishes at **3:00pm**.

What to bring

The essential things to pack in your child's school bag are:

- A full drink bottle of water
- A [waste free lunch](#) box for fruit/vegetable break, a snack and fruit/vegetable for Break 1 and [healthy lunch](#) for Break 2
- **Evelyn Scott School is an anaphylaxis-aware school. This provides protection for children who have severe allergic reactions to certain foods and in particular nuts and nut products. Parents are asked to provide nut free food for their child's snack and lunch. This includes *Nutella* and peanut butter sandwiches.**
- A complete set of spare clothes to accommodate changes in weather and accidents of any kind (for our younger learners, please pack in case of toileting accidents).
- A warm coat and beanie in the cooler months.
- A broad brimmed/sun-safe hat

Please ensure all your child's belongings are clearly labelled.

Communication and Staying Connected

Staying connected to our families is our school's priority. We want you to be a part of your child's learning and encourage families to stay in touch.

Feedback

At Evelyn Scott School we value feedback about our school. Classroom teachers are available for informal and scheduled appointments out of school hours. Voluntary Contributions

Every year we encourage all families to pay a one off voluntary contribution of \$150 for one child or \$250 for families with more than one student attending. There is also a tax deductible Library Trust Fund contribution that families are able to donate.

These voluntary payments contribute towards the running of the school and educational resources for the preschool. Payment details are included in family information packs and on our website under the 'Notes' tab.

Resources for Learning

Families are able to purchase their annual book pack for each child through our local supplier, Blue Ink. The book pack contains consumables used in the classroom throughout the year. Once purchased, the **entire** book pack will be sent to the school in Week 1 of Term 1. Families will receive an email regarding how to order book packs with a special ESS code, prior to the start of the next school year.

These items **do not** need to be labelled and books **do not** need to be covered prior to starting school. Book pack prices may vary slightly depending on the year level of your child. More information regarding ordering will be provided to families prior to the start of the 2023 school year.

The Australian Curriculum


Evelyn Scott School uses the [Australian Curriculum](#) to guide experiences for learners K-10. The framework's vision is for all children to experience learning that is engaging and builds success for life.

Evelyn Scott School uses an inquiry approach to teaching and learning. Inquiry learning is an education approach that focuses on investigation and problem-solving.

Inquiry-based learning is different from traditional approaches because it reverses the order of learning. Instead of presenting information, or 'the answer', upfront, teachers start with a range of scenarios, provocations, questions and problems for learners to navigate.

Inquiry-based learning prioritises problems that require critical and creative thinking so learners can develop their abilities to ask questions, design investigations, interpret evidence, form explanations and arguments, and communicate findings.

The Australian Curriculum is designed to help all young Australians to become successful learners, confident and creative individuals, and active and informed citizens. Presented as a developmental sequence of learning from Foundation - Year 10, the Australian Curriculum describes to teachers, parents, learners and others in the wider community what is to be taught and the quality of learning expected of young people as they progress through school.



School Uniform

"Childhood is about doing. It is about process, action, adventure, motion, trial, error, exploration, discovery, searching, connecting and probing- we call this play"

At Evelyn Scott School we encourage children to be comfortable so they are able to play and learn. We offer a variety of uniform options that are comfortable, hard wearing, sustainably sourced and easy to care for.

We encourage children to wear closed toed shoes to keep little toes safe and for ease of play.

The Evelyn Scott uniform showcases the school's Reed-Warbler logo on a navy backdrop and is the core piece of the uniform. This is coordinated with black bottoms in the form of skorts, shorts, pants and skirts. A transitional dress is also available for purchase. Houses become Bunjis

'Bunji' is an Aboriginal term that means "a mate, a close friend a kinsman" (from Warlpiri and other languages of the Northern Territory and northern Queensland).

We acknowledge that the term 'house' is founded on conservative ideals from a bygone era and we wish to reflect the contemporary nature and philosophy of the school which we have co-created this year. We have sought permission from the EDU Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Education Team and we will utilise the term 'Bunji' in place of the term 'House'.

At the commencement of 2021 we asked our community to vote for Bunji names and colours and the results were:

1. Norris - (Emerald) Named after Dame Ada Norris DBE, CMG was president of the National Council of Women of Victoria from 1951-54 and national president from 1967-70 where she contributed to shaping public opinion and influencing legislation about issues of women's rights, status and opportunities.

2. Rigby - (Purple) Named after Norma Rigby MBE who helped to establish Canberra's Koomarri school and spent much of her life working for the rights of people with a disability or mental illness

3. Golgerth - (Aqua/Light Blue) Named after Joyce Golgerth, anti-conscription activist

4. Felstead - (Burnt orange) Named after Minnie Felstead, union organiser and advocate for women's rights

These Bunji names and colours were selected by the school community to reflect some of the street names in the suburb of Denman Prospect where our school has been built. These names also honour some of Australia's most highly accomplished women advocates.

Learners are placed into Bunjis when they join Evelyn Scott School and will stay in their Bunjis from Preschool to Year 10. Learners come together in their Bunjis across our school sporting events and in their classroom activities. Coloured Bunji polo shirts are available to purchase from our online uniform supplier.
