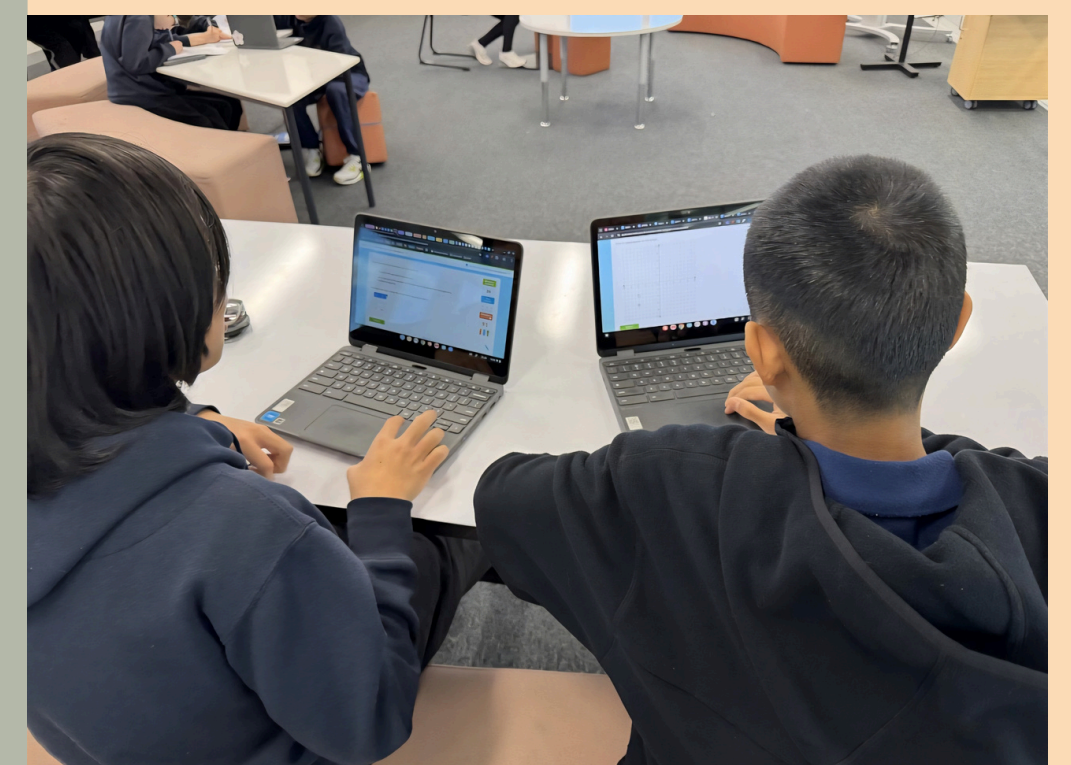

Spotlight on: Maths in Years 7 and 8

This semester, our Year 7/8 teaching teams are taking a targeted and collaborative approach to mathematics learning. In line with the Australian Curriculum, students are participating in masterclasses designed to deepen their understanding of key concepts and skills.

Each masterclass is structured around specific content descriptors, ensuring that learning is purposeful and aligned with national expectations. This approach also allows students to further embed and apply the skills outlined in the Mathematics Achievement Standards for their year level.

By focusing on particular skill areas through short, focused sessions, students are supported to consolidate their understanding, address individual learning needs, and develop greater confidence in applying their mathematical thinking across a range of contexts.
